j) Kit Cars, Hot Rods, Dedicated Rally Cars or Individually Constructed Vehicles:

k) Overseas Imported or Carnet de Passage vehicles: and

I) B & C Class vehicles (vehicle that do not comply to the Road Traffic (Vehicle Standards) Rules and Regulations 2002 and vehicles that require Ministerial

approval);

m) any other inspections authorised in writing by the Director General.

3. The Authorised Person must not allow the premises to be used for inspecting the

following vehicles:

a) Heavy vehicles (a vehicle that has a Gross Vehicle Mass or Aggregate Trailer Mass

exceeding 4,500kg);

b) Overseas Personal Imports

c) Caravans and trailers with an Aggregate Trailer Mass exceeding 4.5 tonne

d) Any vehicle likely to involve a conflict of interest.

4. The Authorised Person must comply with any reasonable directions made by the Director

General in relation to examining and testing of vehicles at the approved premises.

Directions given by the Director General must be in writing and addressed to the

Authorised Person

5. The Authorised Person must not allow a person to examine and test vehicles at the

premises unless that person holds an authorisation to examine and test vehicles, granted

by the Director General under Regulation 3A(1)(a) of the Road Traffic (Licensing)

Regulations 1975.

6. The Authorised Person must ensure this Authorisation is displayed at the premises.

7. The Authorised Person must not examine vehicles at any premises other than those

authorised unless prior approval has been granted by the Director General under

Regulation 3(2)(b) of the Road Traffic (Licensing) Regulations 1975.

8. The Authorised Person must comply with the operating manual/ rules in relation to

operating premises for the purposes of examining and testing of vehicles, as approved

from time to time by General Manager, Driver and Vehicle Services, Department of

Transport.
